

Policy on Research Publications

ARC Industrial Transformation Training Centre for Uniquely Australian Foods

In preparing research publications on Australian native plants, researchers with the *ARC Industrial Transformation Training Centre for Uniquely Australian Foods* will ensure that:

- Research results are widely disseminated in journal articles, books, and reports.
- Research results and publications are translated into a format that ensures that they are shared as widely as possible.
- Indigenous knowledge is not included in project publications without the prior informed consent of the custodians of the knowledge.
- Whenever Indigenous knowledge is used in, informs, or inspires research that leads to publication, Indigenous partners are given the opportunity to be named as a co-author of the resulting project publications.
- Where an Indigenous partner is not named as co-author of a project publication, the Indigenous partner's contribution are recognised and/or acknowledged in project publications, unless they wish otherwise.
- Specific geographical details about the location where plant materials were obtained are not disclosed, without the prior approval of the Indigenous partners.
- Quotes from Indigenous people are not included in project publications, unless the relevant Indigenous partners give prior informed consent to do so.
- Photographs of Indigenous people and photographs taken on Indigenous land are not included in project publications unless the relevant Indigenous partners give prior informed consent to do so.
