

## Procedures for working with Indigenous partners and communities

Steps
<p><b>[1] Pre-engagement</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify potential locations and partner communities</li> <li>• Determine who has the appropriate authority to grant permissions for research</li> </ul>
<p><b>[2] Pre-research &amp; pre-collection</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Send information on ARC Training Centre to community, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Policy on access and use of Indigenous knowledge</li> <li>- Policy on research with native plant materials obtained from Indigenous partners and communities</li> <li>- Policy on research publications</li> <li>- Policy on data collection</li> <li>- Model contractual clauses for the collection of native plant materials from Indigenous land</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Formal obligations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Letter of support from communities for research</li> <li>- Ethics Approval from the University of Queensland</li> <li>- Permits from relevant government authorities/communities</li> <li>- Project Agreement between the Training Centre and community (based on model contractual clauses for the collection of native plant materials from Indigenous land)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p><b>[3] During research</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Communicate interim research results</li> <li>• Discuss plans for communication of research outputs (publications, seminars, reports, etc)</li> </ul>
<p><b>[4] After-research</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Communicate final research results with communities</li> <li>• Discuss future possible collaborations</li> </ul>
