

# Procedures for working with Indigenous partners and communities

## Steps

## [1] Pre-engagement

- Identify potential locations and partner communities
- Determine who has the appropriate authority to grant permissions for research

# [2] Pre-research & pre-collection

- Send information on ARC Training Centre to community, including:
  - Policy on access and use of Indigenous knowledge
  - Policy on research with native plant materials obtained from Indigenous partners and communities
  - Policy on research publications
  - Policy on data collection
  - Model contractual clauses for the collection of native plant materials from Indigenous land
- Formal obligations:
  - Letter of support from communities for research
  - Ethics Approval from the University of Queensland
  - Permits from relevant government authorities/communities
  - Project Agreement between the Training Centre and community (based on model contractual clauses for the collection of native plant materials from Indigenous land)

### [3] During research

- Communicate interim research results
- Discuss plans for communication of research outputs (publications, seminars, reports, etc)

### [4] After-research

- Communicate final research results with communities
- Discuss future possible collaborations
